The forest is divided into an observation area and a hands-on activity area. The forests representing 9,500 years ago and 7,500 years ago have both been replicated.

This forest was opened in 2002 in order to conserve and utilize the Uenohara Site. It

Matsushita Museum of Art



The museum has 6 exhibition rooms. They house western paintings, Japanese paintings, materials of the ancient Near East, hanging scrolls, masks and Satsuma potteries. The main collections include art works by Kuroda Seiki, Wada Eisaku and Togo Seiji. These Kagoshima related artists were active from the Meiji to early Showa periods. Another feature is the paintings by impressionists such as Renoir, Monnet and Bonnard. A nationwide contest for the best Southern Kyushu Suibokuga (Indian ink painting) is held annually and the winning work exhibited every year since 1987.
