On the first floor, there is a topographic model which allows visitors to have an overal view of the historic sites and major facilities of the city. In the movie section, people can see folk art and annual events.

The second floor is divided into folklore, archeology and history sections. What you will find exhibited there is a restored traditional house, the site of the Miyatagaoka roof tile baking kiln where the roof tiles for Osumi Kokubunji temple were made, materials related to Shimadzu Yoshihiro. Chosa dolls, materials related to Chosamatsubara salt field and the restored living room of an ordinary house of the mid 1950s.
