- Headache, stomachache, vomiting, hyperventilation
- Loss of appetite

Mind

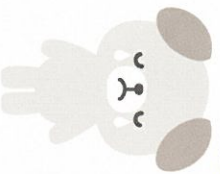
- Lack of trust in humanity
- Nervous, fearful, irritated
- Distracted
- Reproach yourself
- Feel sadness, loneliness

Life

- Afraid of crowds and cannot go outside
- Avoid things and places that recall the painful experience

In the case of children

- Have nightmares
- Infantile regression, verbosity
- Fidgety, hyperactive
- Frequent urination
- Decline in academic performance



The reactions above can occur to anyone after a serious traumatic event and are not unusual. They are said to subside gradually over time. It is important to take things slowly.

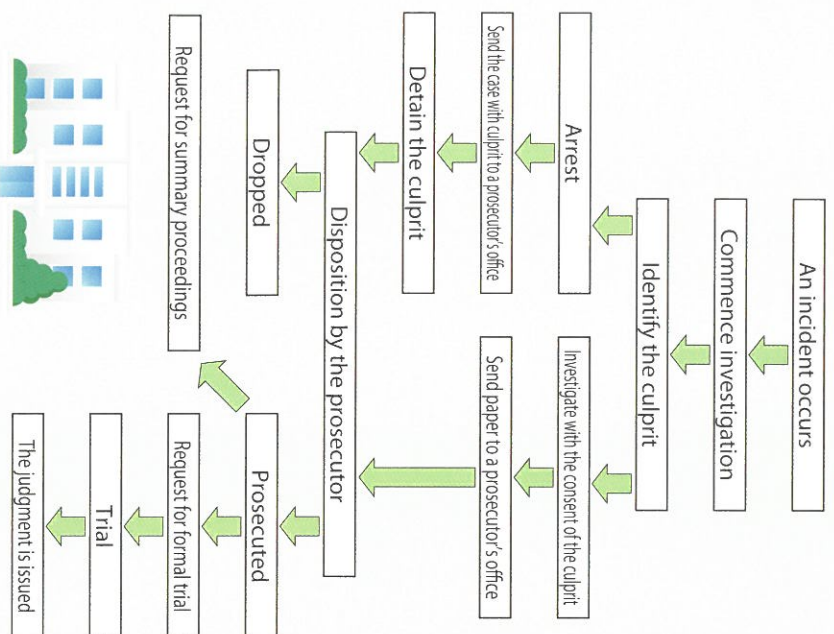

Flow of Criminal Procedure



We ask for your cooperation.

● Police interview

We will ask for detailed information about the circumstances and state of the incident/accident.

● Submission and return of evidence

We may ask you to submit the clothes you were wearing and the items you were carrying at the time of the incident as evidence necessary for identifying alleged fact of case.

● Attendance at on-site investigation

You may be asked to attend the criminal scene during an on-the-spot investigation by police.

General Support by Police

[Victim Support Staff System]

We will provide various support activities as needed and requested by the victims immediately after the incident/accident.

- Attendance
- Attendance at the hospital
- Attendance during an on-the-spot investigation
- Transportation support to and from home
- Interview
- Consultation services regarding anxiety, fear
- Creating/Supporting to create a written statement.
- Introduction of related organizations, handover
- Introduction of private victim support groups and other relevant organizations, handover
- Introduction and handover of counseling services



[Victim Liaison System]

Our investigator or victim liaison staff will inform you of the case information as long as it does not interfere with the ongoing investigation.

- Investigation status
- The arrest of the culprit
- The name and address of the culprit, and summary of the case
- Disposition status of the suspect

[Prevention Against Revictimization and Protection measures]

In cases where there is a risk of the victims or family members being harmed again by the assailant, they are treated as a revictimization prevention target. We ensure their safety through crime prevention guidance that includes emergency reporting procedures and vigilance measures.

[Safety Measures for Women and Children]

We work in cooperation with the Women's Consultation Center and the Child Guidance Center to ensure the safety of victims of domestic violence, child abuse, and stalking.

Reduction of Financial and Emotional Burden

Reduction of Financial Burden

[Reduction of Financial Burden]

- Public expenditure system for medical expenses
- Medical certificate fee, emergency contraceptive costs, costs of test for STDs, and abortion expenses
- Public expenditure system for securing a temporary shelter
- Consultation system
- The above are publicly funded under certain conditions.



[Benefit System for Crime Victims]

The government provides benefits to the bereaved family members of those who have died unexpectedly, those who have suffered serious injuries or illnesses, and those who have been left with disabilities as a result of intentional criminal acts.
